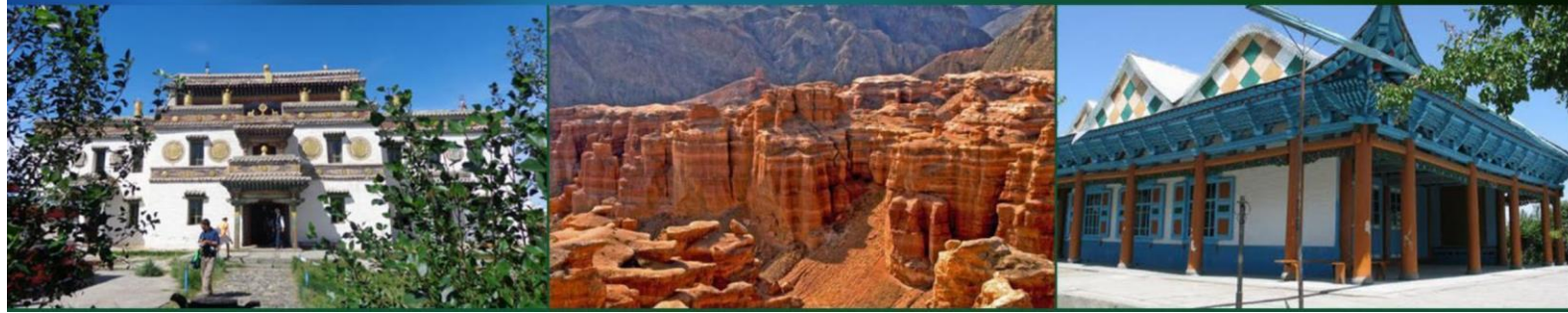

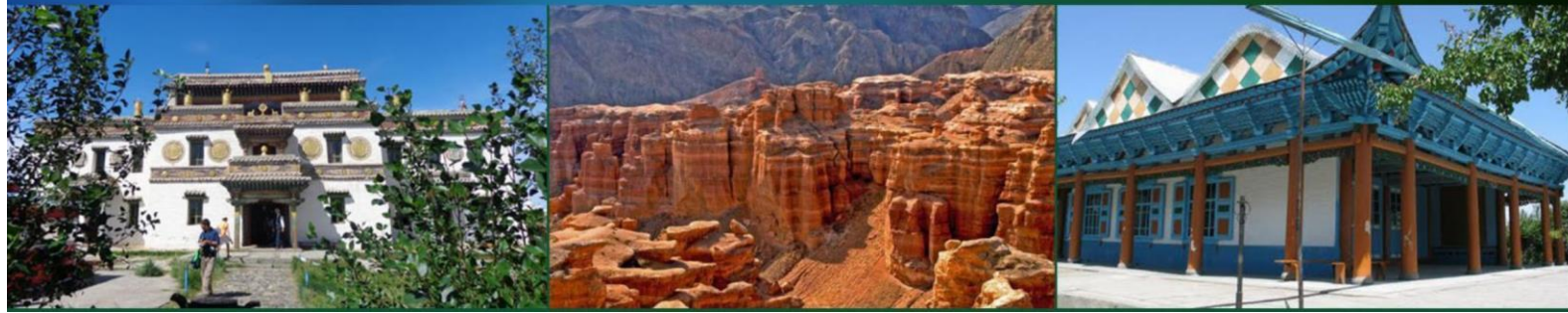

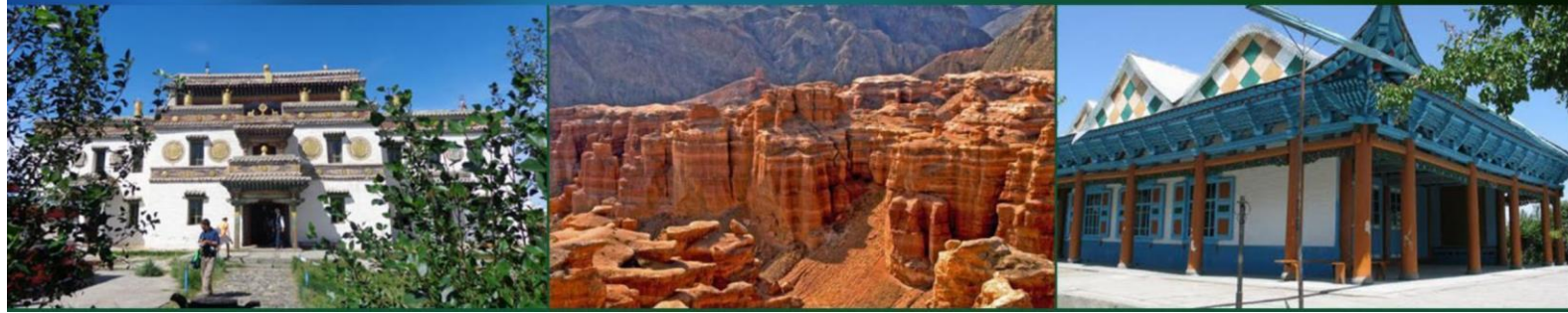


DAY BY DAY ITINERARY:

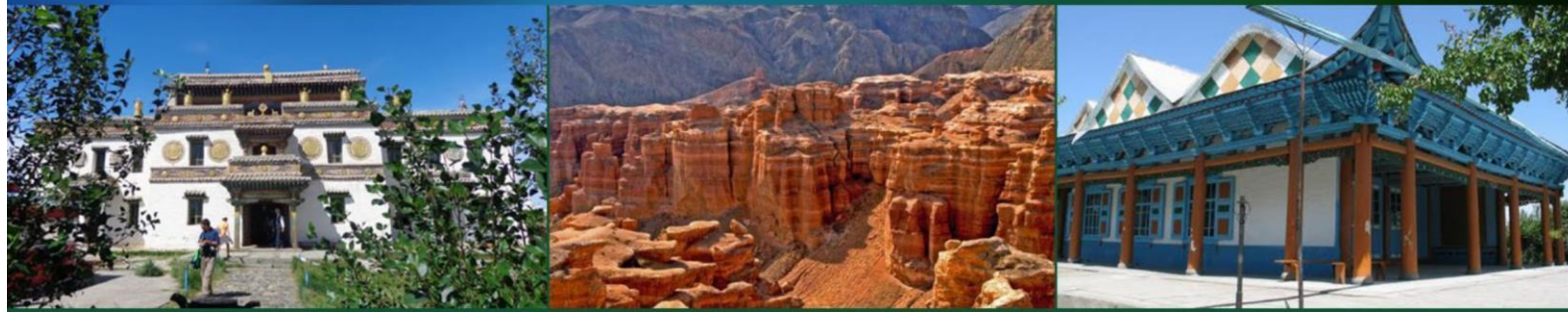
Day 1-Upon your arrival in **Ulaanbaatar** ``Genghis Khan`` **New Airport** and after custom formalities and baggage claim, you will be met by **Samar Magic Tours team** and taken to the hotel (*by hotels policy the check-in time is after **02:00PM/14:00**). **Ulaanbaatar City tour**: Visit the **New Museum "Genghis Kan" ("Chinggis Khaan")**, finally opened in **October 11-2022**. The museum is designed to show the history of the Mongol kings from the reign of King Hunnu Modun Shanyu to the abdication of the Eighth Jebtsundamba. **Welcome lunch in local traditional restaurant**. Visit the Central Square, here you will see a large statue of the **Genghis Khan**-inaugurated in 2006 on the occasion of 800th Anniversary of the Great Mongolian Empire of **Genghis Khan** (1206-2006), the **Sukh Baatar Hero** along with The Parliament House, Stock Exchange, the Drama Theatre and the Palace of Culture. Visit the **National History Museum**-where you will see artefacts from Mongolia and Central Asia from the Stone Age to the present. **05:00PM-Mongolian National Performers** (concert which includes the Tsam dance, traditional Mongolian singers, dancers, Tuvan throat singing and contortionists). Transfer to hotel. Overnight at Holiday Inn hotel 5 stars or at Premium Palace hotel 4 stars or similar. Dinner is not included. **(L)**



Day 2-Breakfast. **09:00AM**-Meet Samar Magic Tours team at reception of the hotel. Visit the **Gandantegchinlen Monastery** is a Tibetan-style Buddhist monastery that has been restored and revitalized since 1990. The Tibetan name translates to the "Great Place of Complete Joy". It currently has over 150 monks in residence. It features a 26.5-meter-high statue of Avalokitesvara. It came under state protection in 1994. Here you will have the opportunity to attend a Buddhist ceremony. Next, drive towards to visit the **40 meter / ~133,3 feet Genghis Khan Statue on horseback** (55km/34miles) N/E of the Mongolian capital Ulaanbaatar. The statue is symbolically pointed east towards his birthplace. It is on top of the Genghis Khan Statue Complex, a visitor center, itself 10 meters (32 ft 10 in) tall, with 36 columns representing the 36 khans from Genghis to Ligdan Khan. Visitors walk to the head of the horse through its chest and neck of the horse, where they can have a panoramic view. After, continuous drive north further to reach **Gorkhi/Terelj National Park**. Seeing grasslands and beautiful vistas. The valley is about 20kms/12miles long at 1600m. This picturesque National Park is a part of Khan Khentii Strictly Protected Area. It is a great place for hiking, trekking, even you can rock climb here at its natural steep granite walls. Explore the **Turtle shaped original giant rock** - symbol of Gorkhi/Terelj Overnight in Tourist Gers Camp. **(B)(L)(D)**



Day 3-Breakfast. **Free time in your own.** Meet Samar Magic Tours team and the transport. **Drive back to Ulaanbaatar city** (70km/34miles). **Lunch is included in local restaurant in Ulaanbaatar.** Transfer to the hotel (*by hotels policy the check-in time is after **02:00PM/14:00**). Overnight at Holiday Inn hotel 5 stars or at Premium Palace hotel 4 stars or similar. Dinner is not included. **(B)(L)**



Day 4-Breakfast. 08:00AM-Meet Samar Magic Tours team at reception of the hotel. Drive towards west by comfortable 4WD vehicle to observe the **Authentic Mongol Nomad Show** (will take place from **10:00AM-12:00M**, about 40km/25miles, 1.30 hrs). It demonstrates traditional living way real Mongolian nomads and breeding and using of five kinds of livestock and movement from one place to another using ox, yak, camel and horse carts which are the carts. Here you will have the

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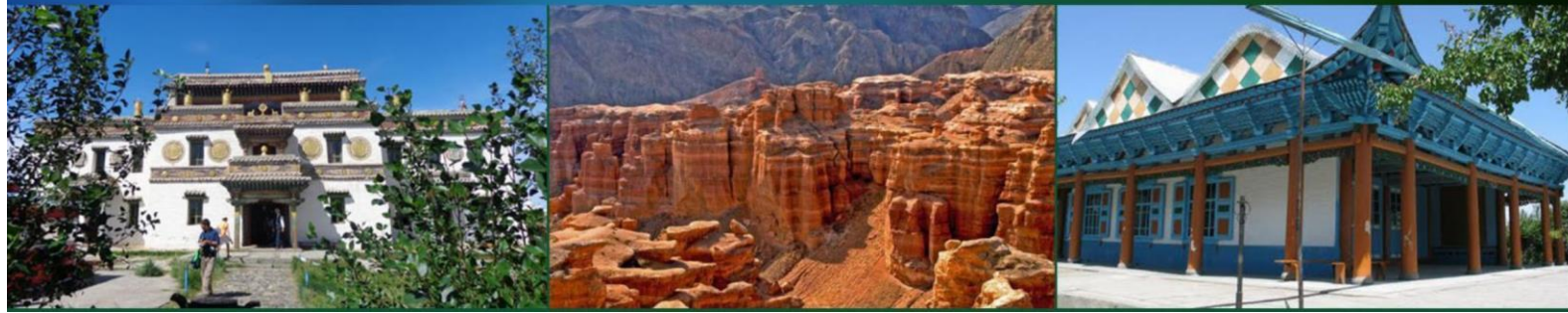
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opportunity to hear a Mongolian folk song, to see 5 herding animals, to observe the demonstration of catching and milking sheep, goat, to observe the demonstration of making dairy products. Also, we will see the Mongolian archery, playing traditional games, the demonstration of making felt and tanning, the demonstration of moving one place to another use by cart, yak freight, camel and horse carts. Next, drive to **Hustain Nuruu National Park** (about 80km/50miles, 1.30 hrs) of the **Wild Horses Przewalski or Takhi** (as known by the Mongolians). The Takhi is the last species of wild horse left on the planet. **Lunch is included in tourist Gers camp.** In 1878, the Polish-born Russian geographer and naturalist **Nikolai Mikhailovich Przewalski** found a new species of wild horse in Mongolia, known locally as Takhi, and took several foals to European zoos. The only way to prevent the complete extinction of the last species of wild horse was to reintroduce it into the wild. In 1975, the **Dutchman Ian Bouman and his wife**, and other entities that joined later, created the **Foundation for the Conservation and Protection of the Przewalski Horse (FPPPH)**, with the aim of saving the Tahki from extinction through acclimatization. of the zoo specimens in open field pastures, for later release into the wild. In 1992, the FPPPH brought the first 15 horses to the Hustain Nuruu area in Mongolia, to reintroduce them to their original habitat. Currently, the population of takhi in the wild in Hustai Nuruu National Park reaches 220 individuals. The practice of taming wild animals and then returning them to the wild is truly rare. Visit to a small museum, about the history of the Hustain Nuruu National Park, about the founders, and the reintroduction of the Przewalski or Takhi wild horses in their original habitat. **Excursion through the interior of the Hustain Nuruu National Park, exploration and observation of wild horses (*bring binoculars).** Overnight in Tourist Gers Camp. **(B)(L)(D)**

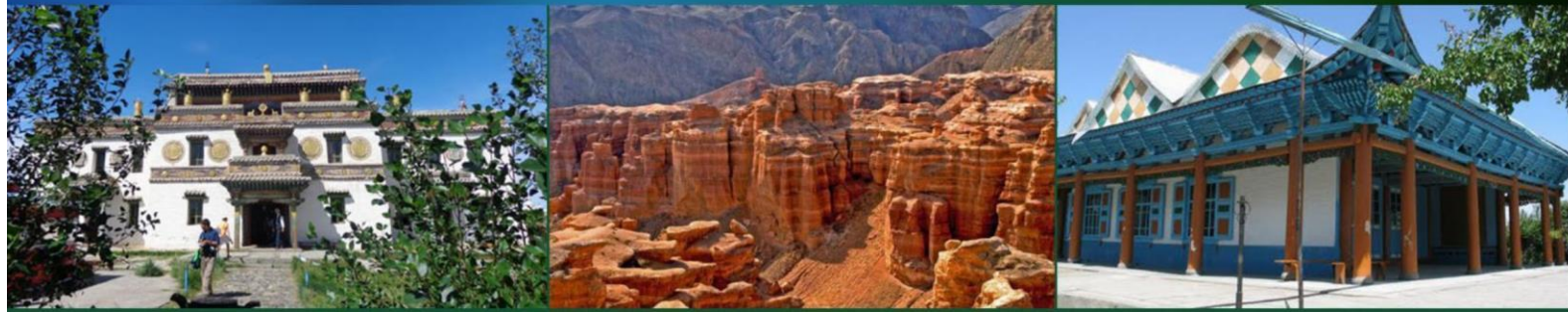




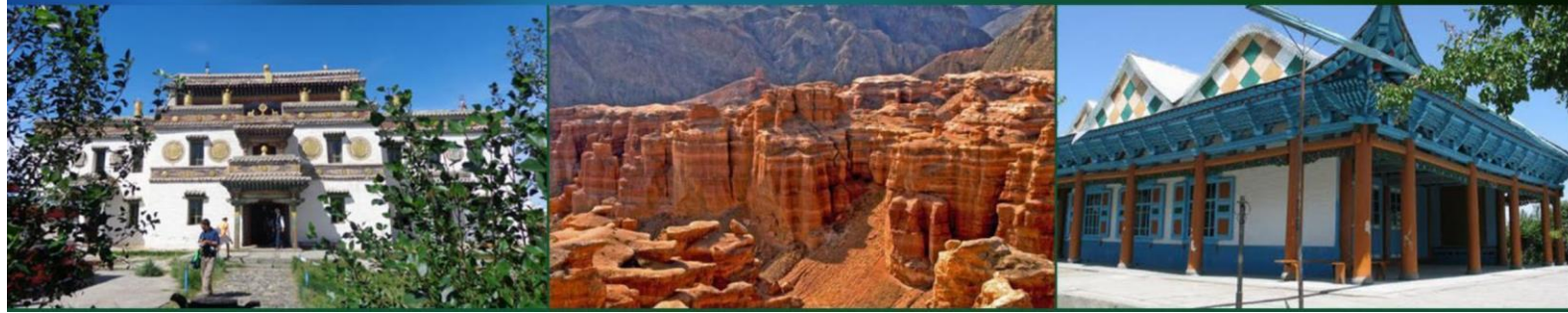
Day 5-Breakfast. Today, we will head to **Karakorum** (about 330km/205miles, 3 - 4 hrs) in Central Mongolia-the **Genghis (Chinggis) Khan's 13th century capital and heart of the mighty Mongolian Empire and Okhon river Valley, cradle of Mongolian civilization**. Visitors, such as Marco Polo, described its ornate building, including a 2500 sq. meters Palace of Worldly Peace. **Free time at your leisure**, for walks through the Orkhon River Valley or rest. Overnight in Tourist Gers Camp in Karakorum. **(B)(L)(D)**



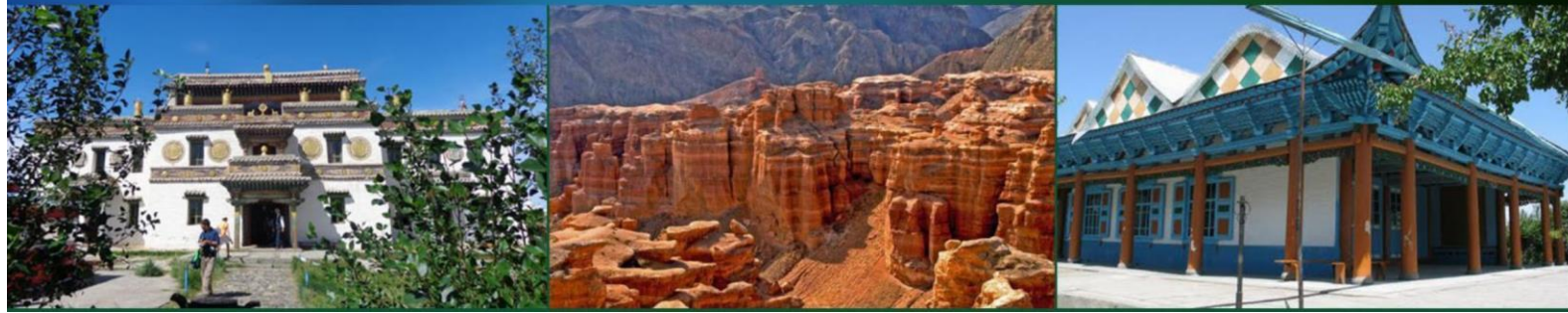
Day 6-Breakfast. In the morning, excursion to see the relics of the ancient capital of the Mongol Empire: **the legendary Erdene zuu (Hundred Treasures) Monastery, the two Turtle monuments, the Karakorum museum** (with the archaeological finds of the early historical period successively including the Xiongnu/Hunnu, and the Turks), and beyond hidden in a small valley, is **the 'phallic rock'**-it is a statue of a penis raised on a platform in the steppe, located near the **Erdene Zuu Monastery** (built in 1585). The statue has dual functions; It is primarily a reminder to monks to remain celibate, but it is also a symbol of fertility and human life. The **Erdene Zuu Buddhist Monastery** with its 108 stupas and the first Buddhist Lamasery (16th century) was the most important religious seat. Currently it constitutes an impressive sight, with its walls, stupas and temples, occupying an enclosure of 400 square meters, and surrounded by the steppe. The construction was continued by his son **'Ogedei' Khan**, after his death. After 40 years, **'Kublai Khan'** (grandson of Genghis Khan and host of Marco Polo) moved the capital of the Empire to Beijing (**Peking-Yuan dynasty**), already invaded. In the year 1792, there were 62 temples left and more than 10,000 Lamas. In the year 1930, the Stalinist purges destroyed most of their temples



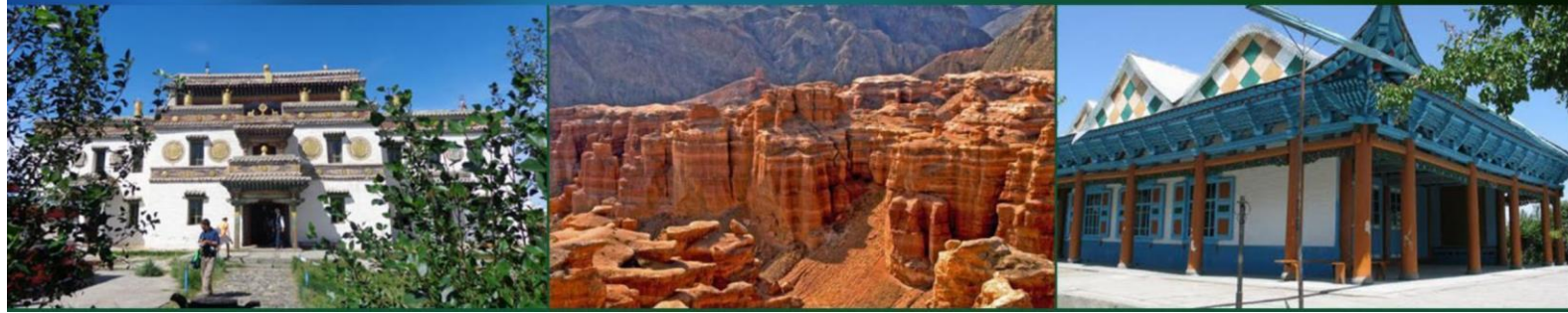
and the Lamas were banished to die in Siberia. Of its more than one hundred temples, only three have survived to our era, it remains the most outstanding cultural vestige of Mongolia. After lunch, departure by asphalt road (*with the help of the Turkish Government) in the direction of the **Gokhturk museum in Khoshoo Tsaidam (Turkish Memorials)** in honor of the Turkish princes in the Orkhon Valley (approximately 47.2km/30miles, 1hr), from the early 8th century Bilge Khan and Kul Tigin with their Orkhon inscriptions, written in the Old Turkic alphabet, which are admitted as the most impressive monuments of the nomadic Gokturk Khaganate. They were excavated and deciphered by Russian archaeologists in the years 1889-93. Next, departure by embankment towards **Lake Ugii** (approximately 32.3km, 1hr), an appropriate place for birds such as: swans, geese, cranes, ducks, pigeons, storks and other migratory species are cited in this area at the end of April, May and throughout the summer). **Lake Ugii** is located in the province of Uvurkhangai, where many migratory birds arrive at certain times of the year due to the abundance of fish. It is of great importance as a breeding and stopping place for waterfowl, for example, the white-necked crane (*Grus vipio*), the swan goose (*Anser cygnoides*), the great bustard (*Otis tarda*), the duck (*Oxyura leucocephala*), cranes common (*Grus Grus*), demoiselle cranes (*Anthropoides virgo*), black storks (*Ciconia nigra*), and species declared vulnerable or endangered in the Red Book. We will be able to admire and photograph a great variety of species such as the White-necked Crane and the Monk Crane surrounded by a beautiful valley where herds of sheep, horses, bulls, and yaks graze. Over 200 species of birds have been recorded at Lake Ugii, and where there are so many fish there are sure to be plenty of waterfowl; black-tailed godwit; Swan goose; Great Crested Grebe; whooper swan; Bar-headed goose; Rudy Shelduck; common goldeneye; Common Crane; and Northern Lapwing. Migratory birds arrive from May to June, from as far away as Siberia and the Himalayas. **Here there is an opportunity for optional horseback riding, fishing, boat rides, kayaks, ornithological observation, etc. (*pay extra on site). Bring binoculars.** Overnight in Tourist Gers Camp, close to Lake Ugii. **(B)(L)(D)**



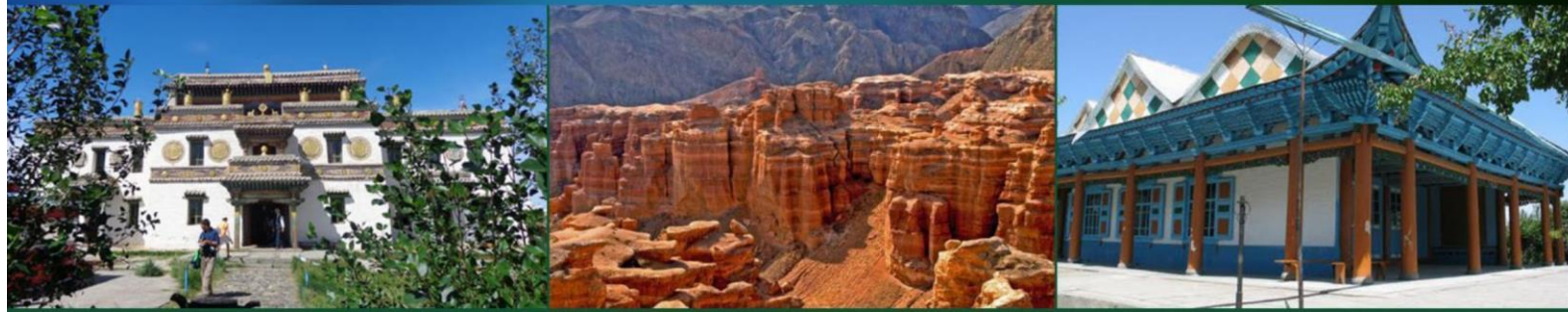
Day 7-Breakfast. Meeting with the Samar Magic Tours team. Departure in the direction of the **Tsenkher Hot Springs Resort** via the Khoshoo Tsaidam road (approximately 198km, 4 hours), located near the Khangai mountains and in a forested area, in the province of Arkhangai. These hot springs are sulphurous springs that flow at a temperature of more than 80 degrees, allowing visitors to enjoy an open-air spa in the middle of nature. These waters are appreciated for their healing properties. **One hour of relaxing baths in the Tsenkher hot springs.** In this area there is a presence of nomadic families where they graze with their herds of horses, yaks, sheep, bulls, etc. There is an opportunity to optionally ride a horse or yak at your leisure (***pay extra on site**). Overnight in Tourist Gers Camp. **(B)(L)(D)**



Day 8-Breakfast. Departure along hard tracks towards the **Orkhon River Waterfall** (approximately 245km, 5:30-6 hours), ten meters wide and twenty meters high. The small lake that forms under the waterfall is impressive, the basalt stones give it some wonderful views by playing with the light and creating dazzling effects in a waterfall in the middle of the country. In route, we will visit **Shank Khiid monastery**, it is connected to the acclaimed Buddhist sculptor and artist "**Zanabazar**". This monastery was once known as the Western Monastery, where more than 1,500 monks lived and miraculously survived the purges of the 1930s. At the waterfall of the Orkhon River, we can enjoy some relaxing baths. Overnight in Tourist Gers Camp. **(B)(L)(D)**



Day 9-Breakfast. Then heading to **Elsen Tasarkhai Dunes (known as the Bayangobi Desert,** approx. 280km/123miles, 4-5hours drive), desert sand dunes spread over 80kms in a beautiful valley. Opportunity for hiking, walking through the dunes, and photographing the landscapes. We will visit an authentic nomadic family with Bactrian camel farms. **One hour of excursion included**



to cross the dunes on the back of a Bactrian camel. Then, departure to the **Khugnu Khan Peak Nature Reserve** (approx. 15.2km/10 miles, 30 min)-it is a Peak of 1967 meters, with hiking possibilities, and walks to a small function **temple 'Uvgun'**, destroyed in the year 1660. The temple was reopened in 1992 and is currently served by two monks from Ulaanbaatar. Return (approx. 15.2km/10 miles, 30 min). **At sunset we can admire a beautiful sunset over the dunes.** Overnight in Tourist Gers Camp. **(B)(L)(D)**



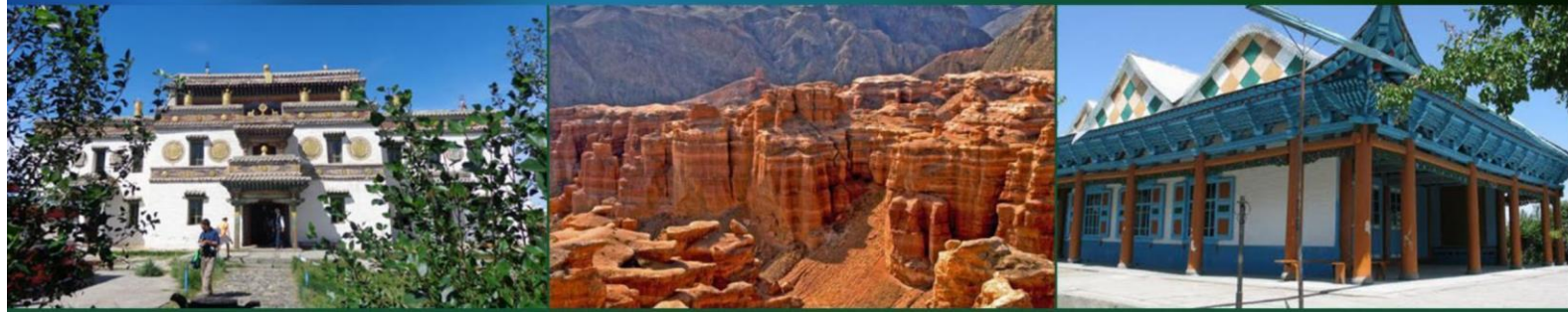
Day 10-Breakfast. Return to Ulaanbaatar (about 280km/123miles, 4-5hours drive, depending on the traffic at the entrance to Ulaanbaatar). Transfer to the hotel (*the rooms can be used after **2:00 p.m.** on the day of arrival). **Latest purchases of Mongolian souvenirs and pure Mongolian cashmere. Farewell dinner at local restaurant.** Transfer to the hotel. Overnight at Holiday Inn hotel 5 stars or at Premium Palace hotel 4 stars or similar. **(B)(L)(D)**



Day 11-Breakfast. Transfer to **Ulaanbaatar ``Genghis Khan`` New Airport**. Take your International flight to **Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan**. Arrive in Bishkek at **Manas International airport**. Drive to **Archa National Park** (about 40kms/25miles), located in a picturesque **gorge of Ala Archa** (about 40kms from Bishkek). On the way to the park short stop at the traditional Kyrgyz cemetery and excursion to the **Gumbez (mausoleum) of Baitik Baatyr**, the local respected tribal leader. At the territory of the park tourists can trek up the **Ak Sai gorge** (side gorge of the main Ala Archa gorge) to enjoy views of magnificent peaks of **Kyrgyz Alatau Ridge (Tien Shan Mountains)**. Easy hike along the fast mountain river in the main gorge of **Ala Archa**. After excursion **drive back to Bishkek**. Dinner in local café. Overnight in hotel. **(B)(L)(D)**



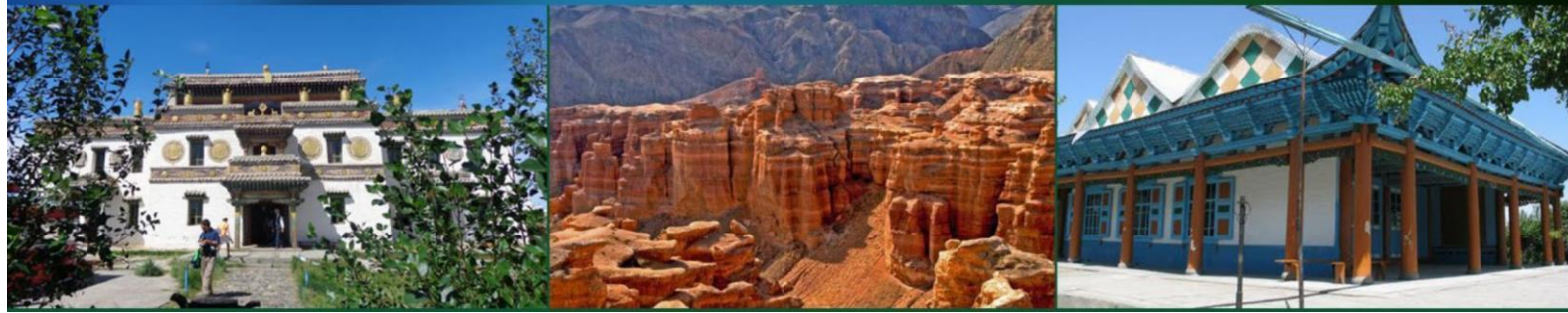
Day 12-Breakfast. One-hour drive to **Burana Tower**, near Tokmok city. That minaret was constructed in Balasagun town; one of the capitals of Karakhanid State existed in 11-12 centuries AD. Explore ruins of that important trading point at the **Great Silk Road** and visit a little local museum telling about that civilization. Also watch a collection of Balbals, Turkic ancient tombs. We drive to the **Issyk Kul Lake**, the second largest alpine lake in the world after Lake Titicaca in South America. Lunch in route. In summer, the water temperature reaches 25-28 degrees centigrade (warmer than the air) and you can swim in the lake enclosed on all sides by the snowy peaks of the



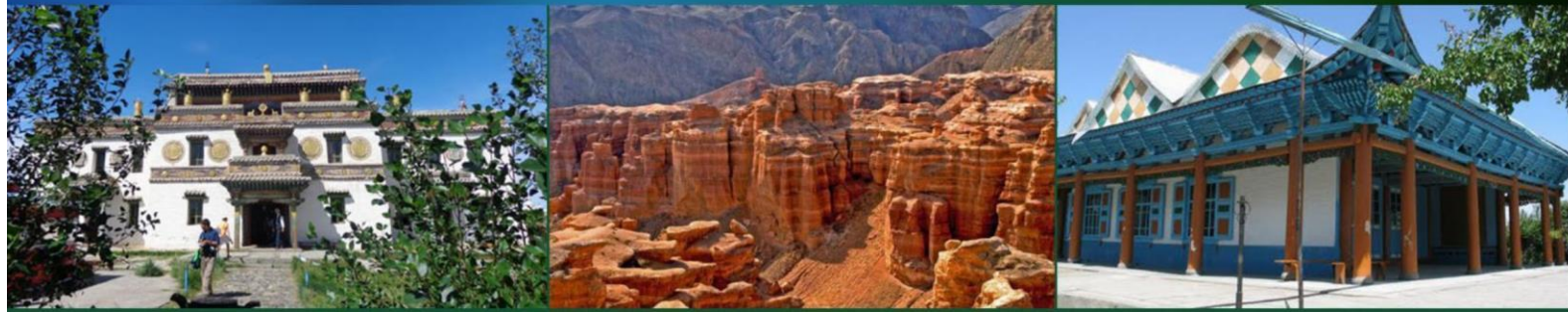
Tien Shan Mountains. Dinner in café. Overnight in hotel on the lake shore. **(B)(L)(D)**



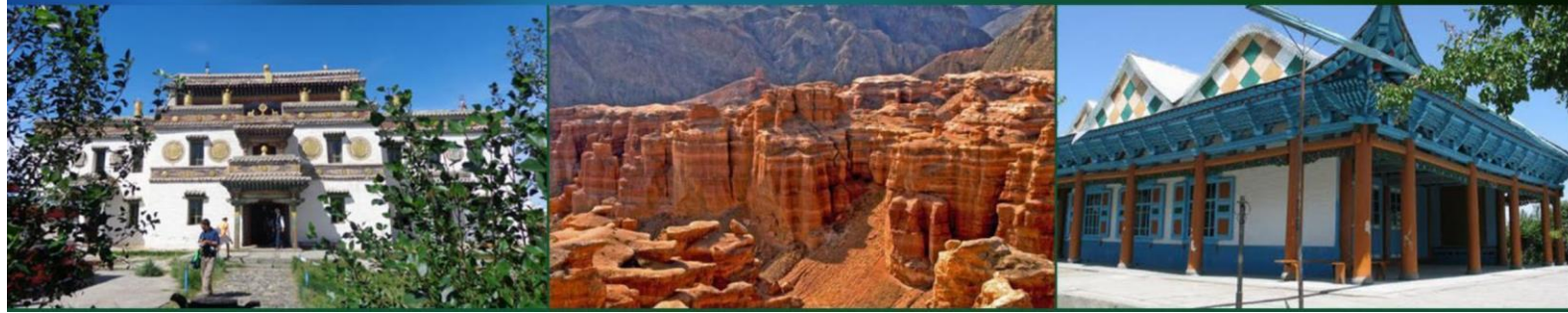
Day 13-Breakfast. Visit the **Cholpon Ata Petroglyphs site**-this is a large open-air collection of rock carvings sometimes referred to as a Stone Garden, which covers some 42 hectares and contains a number of prehistoric monumental structures (stone circles, tombs, the remains of a boundary stone wall, Balbals) and Petroglyphs (dating from the II millennium BC thru the Middle Ages and up to the VI century AD). After, excursion drives to **Karakol town** situated in the east of the lake area, at the foot of the most picturesque mountains of Tien Shan. On the way visit the museum of N. M. Przhevalski, the outstanding Russian explorer of Asian continent. Upon your arrival at Karakol, we have lunch. Visit the **Dungan mosque**, a unique construction in Chinese style, but serving as a mosque. Also you will see an **Old Russian Orthodox Church** – Holy Trinity Cathedral made of wood without any nails. We will visit the **Ethnographical museum** to learn more about the different nationalities inhabiting the territory of Kyrgyzstan. You can also walk around the town to see the blockhouses of the 19th century, which were built in Russian style (white houses with blue windows) and sometimes called "ginger man" or "doll houses". Dinner in café. Overnight in the guest house. **(B)(L)(D)**



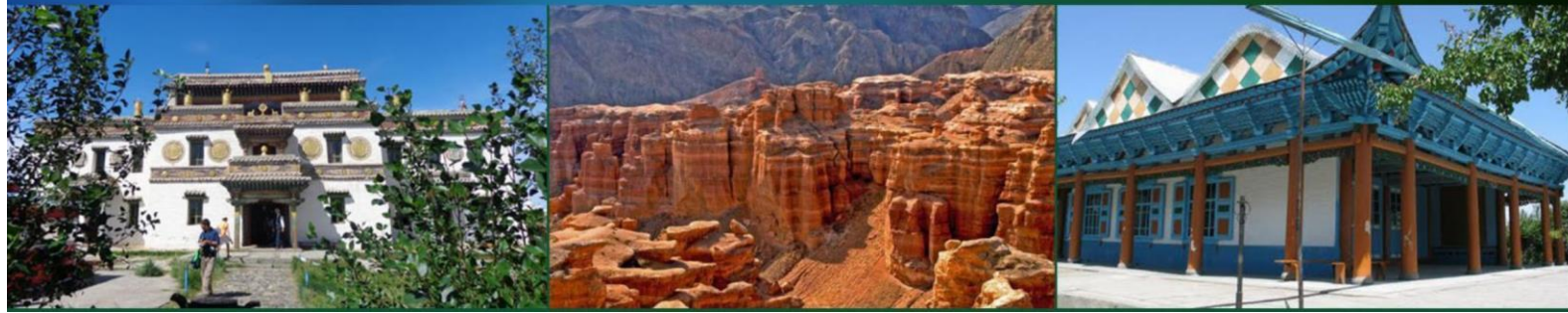
Day 14-Breakfast. Drive towards to **Djety Oguz Gorge (means "Seven Bulls")**. This picturesque gorge is named so because of the red rocky sand formations covered with forests of Tien Shan spruces. Upon arrival in the gorge short hiking to admire the scenery of the gorge from bird eye's view. Lunch in camp. Dinner and overnight in yurt camp. **(B)(L)(D)**



Day 15-After breakfast, start your trip along the southern shore of the **Issyk Kul Lake**. Transfer to **Kochkor village** along the southern shore of the **Issyk Kul Lake**. On the way, we admire landscapes and make several stops for short hiking in the most picturesque spots. Lunch in route in Bokonbaevo village. Further drive to **Kochkor village** where you can watch how local people make felt, various carpets, embroidering and spinning, and other handicraft stuff. We also visit a handicraft museum and a shop, where you can buy different masterpieces - starting from huge felt-silk blankets, finishing with small Christmas tree decorations. Dinner and overnight in a home stay family in Kochkor. **(B)(L)(D)**

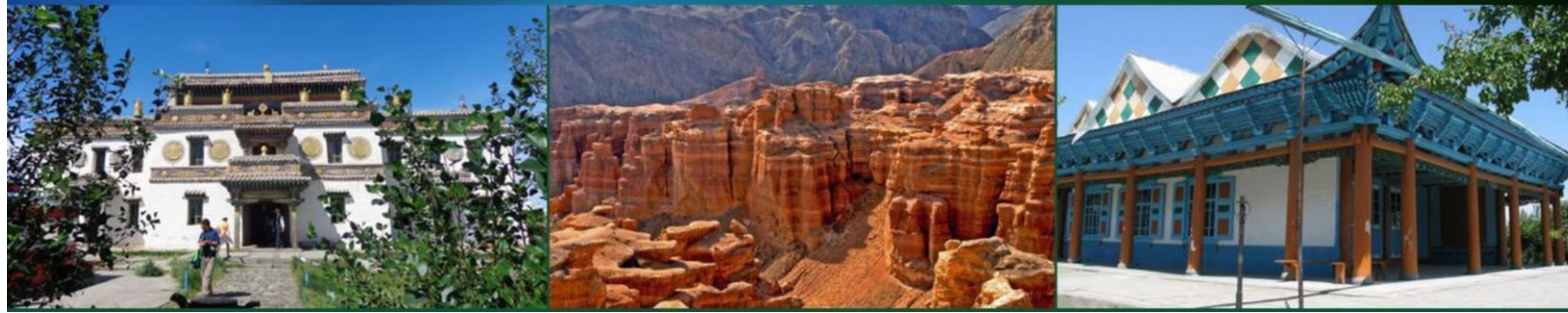


Day 16-Breakfast. Drive to **Kochkor village for Son Kul Lake**. It is a fabulous mountain lake located in **Tien Shan Mountain Range** at the altitude of 3016m above sea level. The route to Son-Kul winds through mountainous terrain until it seems to disappear into the very sky itself. You pass greenery valley and a very dramatic pass on your way to the lake. Upon arrival, accommodation and lunch in the camp. Today, we step into the nomadic life at the **Son Kul Lake**. Here the Kyrgyz people still live in traditional simplicity. We enjoy horseback riding or just hiking, spend time with always friendly Kyrgyz families and taste their fresh airan (yogurt) and kumis (a fermented national drink from mare's milk). Dinner and overnight in the yurt camp. **(B)(L)(D)**



Day 17-Breakfast. Drive back to Bishkek through **Kochkor village**, where we have lunch. We pass through "**Boom Gorge**", which lies at the eastern end of the Kyrgyz Range and provides the only corridor between two Chui and Issyk Kul regions. Converging together through this narrow canyon are a highway, a railway (rising high above the road apparently it was built by German prisoners of war, the first train to travel along the 189km track to Balykchi was in 1948), and the **Chu River** (so belloyed by white-water rafters). Upon your arrival in **Bishkek**, to be transferred to the hotel. Overnight at hotel. **(B)(L)(D)**

Day 18-Breakfast. Transfer to International airport "Manas" to catch your flight back home or **extension tour to Uzbekistan** (excluding the departure flight). **(B)**

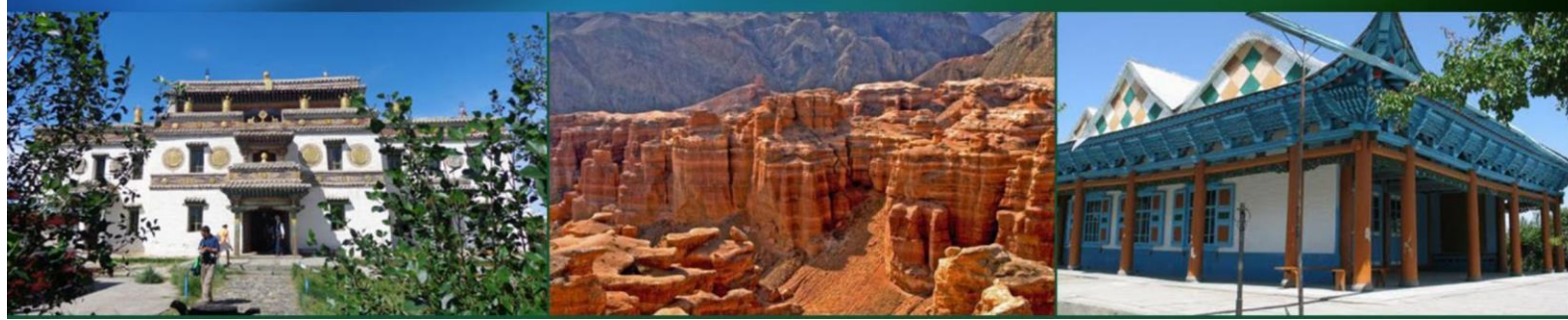

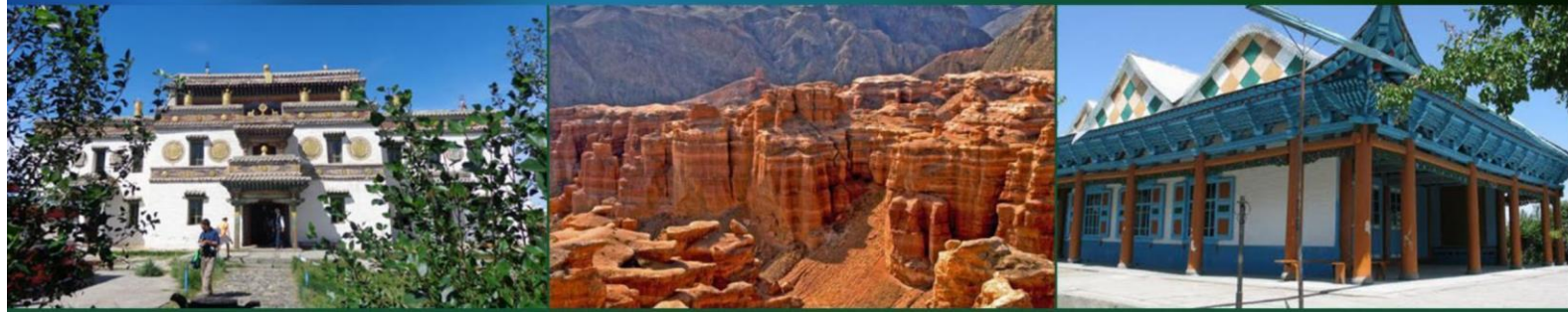
